Rangitihī fathered eight children, they are the ancestors of the many Te Arawa tribes living in the Rotorua Lakes region. Ranatihī was carved by Kima Hakaraia.

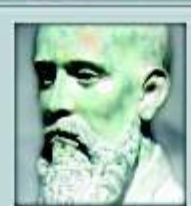

2 WAITUKEI
GOVERNMENT GARDENS
A bronze sculpture unveiled in 2001 to mark the new millennium. Supported by the Millennium and Rotorua Trusts. Waitukei is by Rotorua artist Lyonel Grant, and inspired by the melding of Maori and European cultures.



3 MALFROY SCULPTURE
GOVERNMENT GARDENS
A work by George Andrews, a well known local sculptor. Camille Malfroy, a French-born engineer was in charge of works in Rotorua following the Tarawera eruption. Malfroy became well known for his work regulating hot pools and controlling geyser.
He manipulated Pohutu Geyser at Whakarewarewa so that it would erupt regularly, and also created the artificial Malfroy Geysers, the area around which the Oruwhata-Malfroy fence by Jamie Pickernell stands.
